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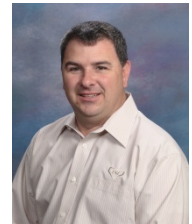
FNF ANNOUNCES NEW CHIEF ESTIMATOR

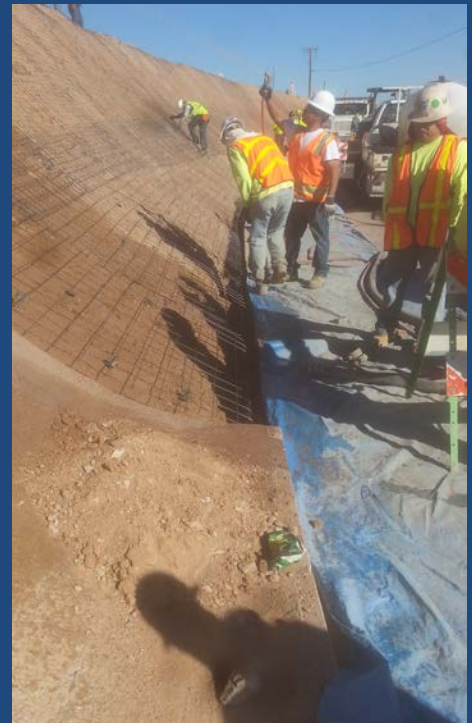

Gila Bend Streets Project Details

Agency/Owner: Arizona Department of Transportation
Contractor: FNF Construction, Inc.

This \$3.3 million ADOT project is located in downtown Gila Bend on SR Business 8 between the Gillespie canal and I-8 for a distance of 3 miles. The work consisted of milling the existing failed pavement and replacing it with ¾ inch AC along with bridge deck modifications and sidewalk replacements. It became evident early on that maintaining business access and safe pedestrian passage ways along with community relations would be key factors in the project's success.

Many natural and historical wonders are located in and around Gila Bend and attract visitors from around the world. The project team developed goals and a plan that would ensure that these issues were handled effectively and allowed the construction to completely stop during the busiest weeks around Christmas and the New Year. Partnering was an attitude of continuous, high-spirited cooperation and flexibility that was the key to building a quality project on budget and ahead of schedule.

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FNF RECEIVES NAPA QUALITY IN CONSTRUCTION AWARD

FNF Construction Inc. of a 2014 Quality in Construction Award for excellence in construction of an asphalt pavement on the [Navajo Route 20/89T Detour Construction Manager at Risk](#) ADOT project. The company received its award on Wednesday, Jan. 28, at a ceremony during the association's 60th Annual Meeting in Marco Island, Fla.

"Quality pavements are something every road builder strives to construct. We want to build pavements that deliver on the promise of high performance and drivability for the public," said William C. Ensor III, NAPA 2014 Chairman. "Projects that earn a Quality in Construction Award have been measured against industry best practices designed to live up to that promise. I'm proud to say that, in earning a 2014 QIC Award, FNF Construction Inc. has met or exceeded these rigorous quality standards."

The awarded project, Navajo Route 20/US 89T in the Navajo Nation, was an emergency project that required FNF to build a temporary paved detour on a dirt road to bypass an essential road closed by a landslide. FNF worked closely with subcontractors and the Arizona Department of Transportation to reduce times for material placement and to streamline construction procedures.
